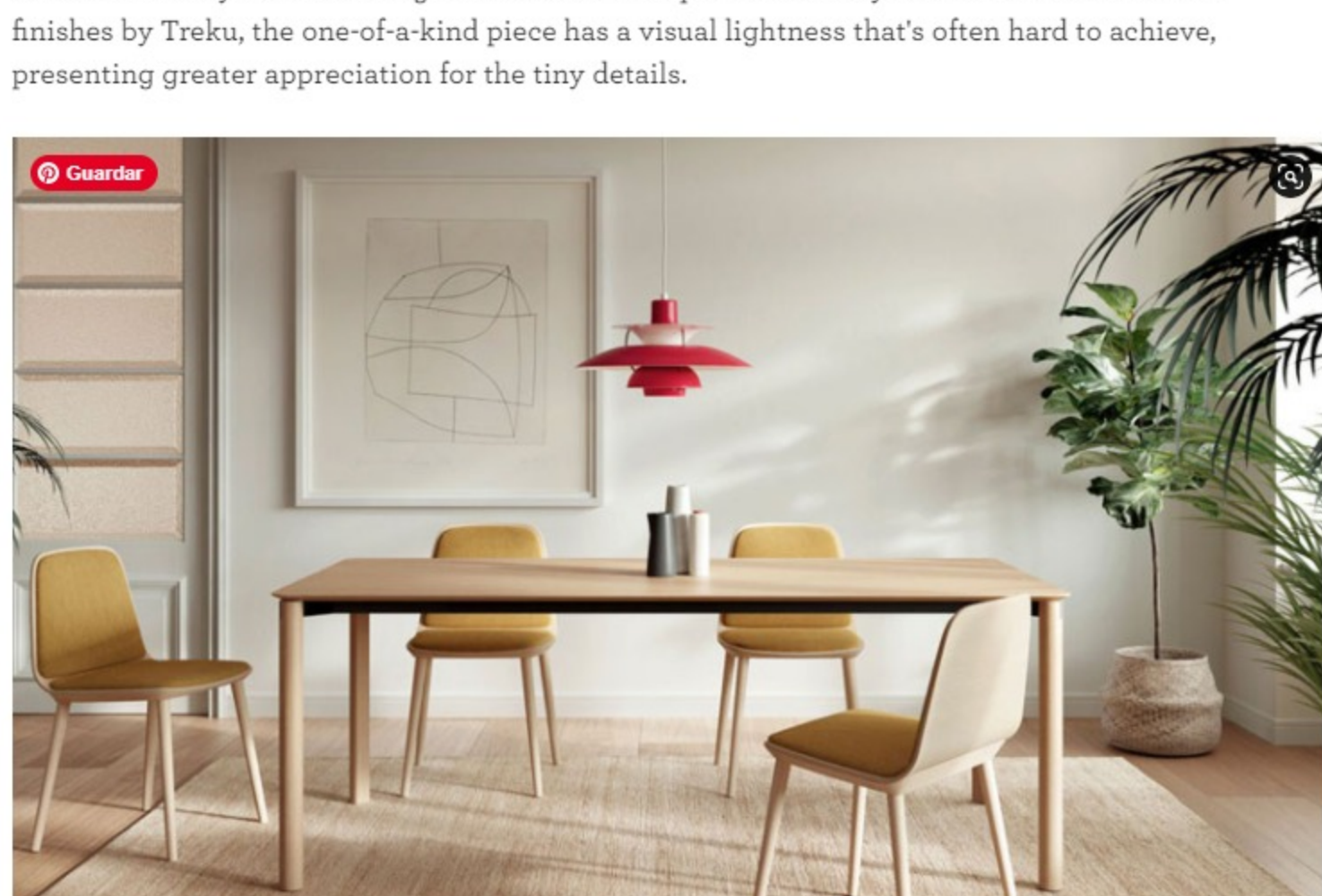
TRENDS APRIL EDIT III: THE LATEST IN PRODUCT LAUNCHES AROUND THE GLOBE

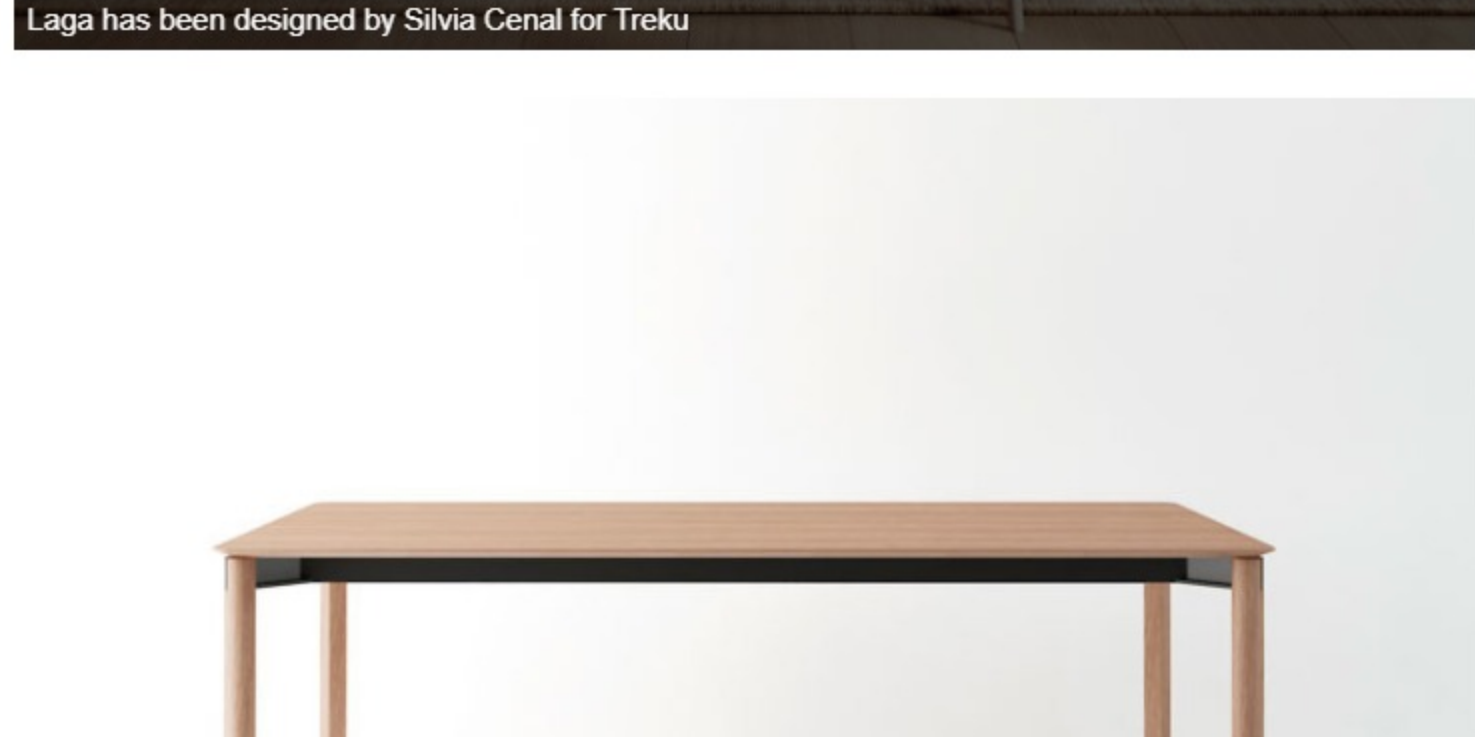
Well designed products go beyond their form and function - they also have the ability to adapt to the changing needs of its user. Our latest edit of new products follows the life of a few such products imagined by renowned and upcoming designers. Read on to know more:

1. Laga by Silvia Cenal for Treku

The result of a year-long collaboration between Basque manufacturer Treku, and designer Silvia Cenal. Laga is an extendable table with intricate details. The minimal design is all about highlighting the little things, like the metallic detail embedded in the table legs or the tabletop that does not entirely rest on the legs. Finished in a lacquer in a variety of new colours and wood finishes by Treku, the one-of-a-kind piece has a visual lightness that's often hard to achieve, presenting greater appreciation for the tiny details.

2. Clay Roof Tile Furniture by Manoj Patel

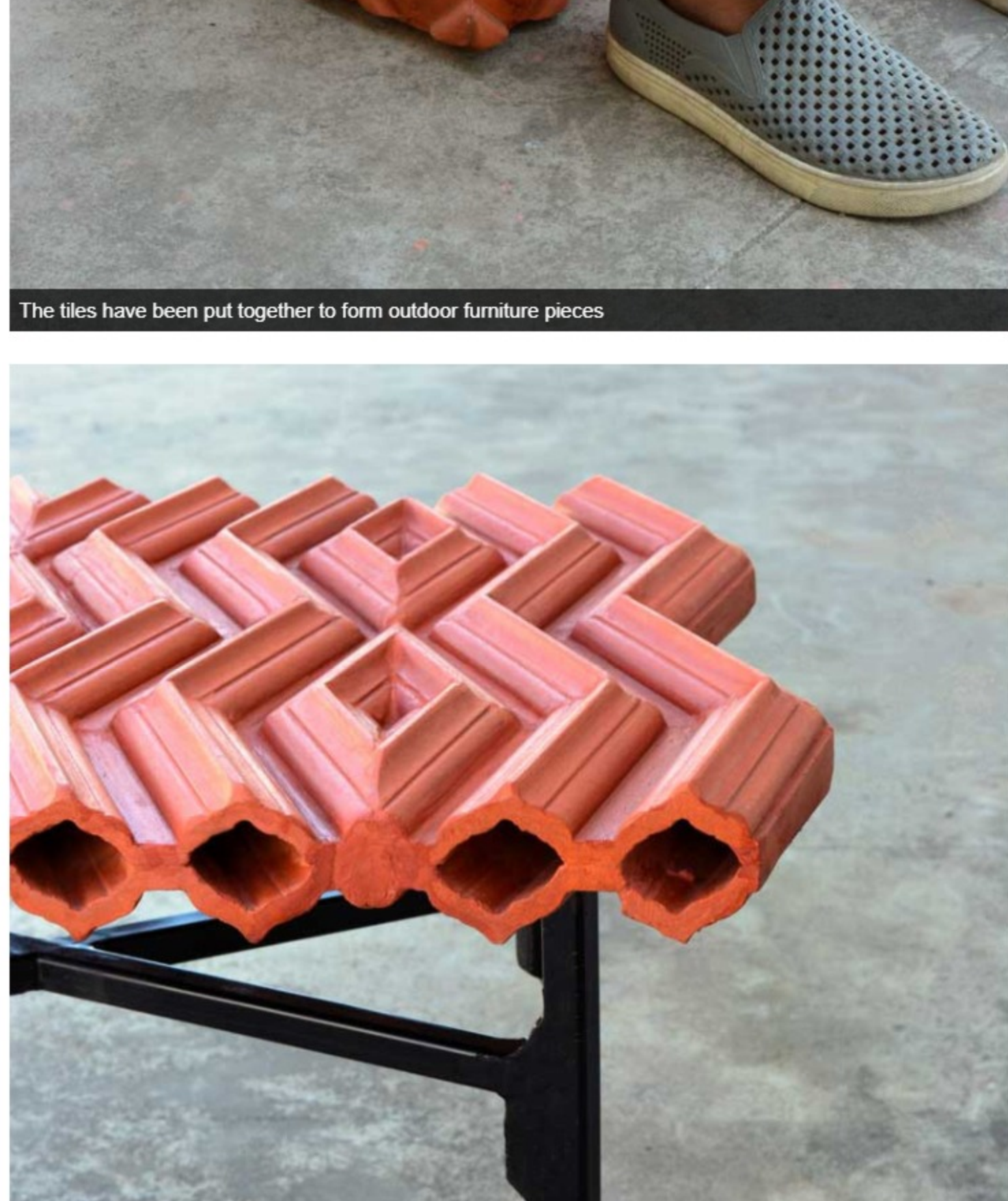
Using a vernacular material and fitting it into the modern Indian urban fabric, with a touch of sustainability, designer Manoj Patel has designed a range of outdoor furniture pieces using clay roof tiles. When put together, these tiles create playful optical illusions that resemble a natural volumetric mass with interesting patterns. The set comprises a table and seating stool in the original earthy tones and handcrafted patterns of clay roof tiles. Although the pieces have been formed by simply combining pieces of tile together, the joinery is smooth and clean.



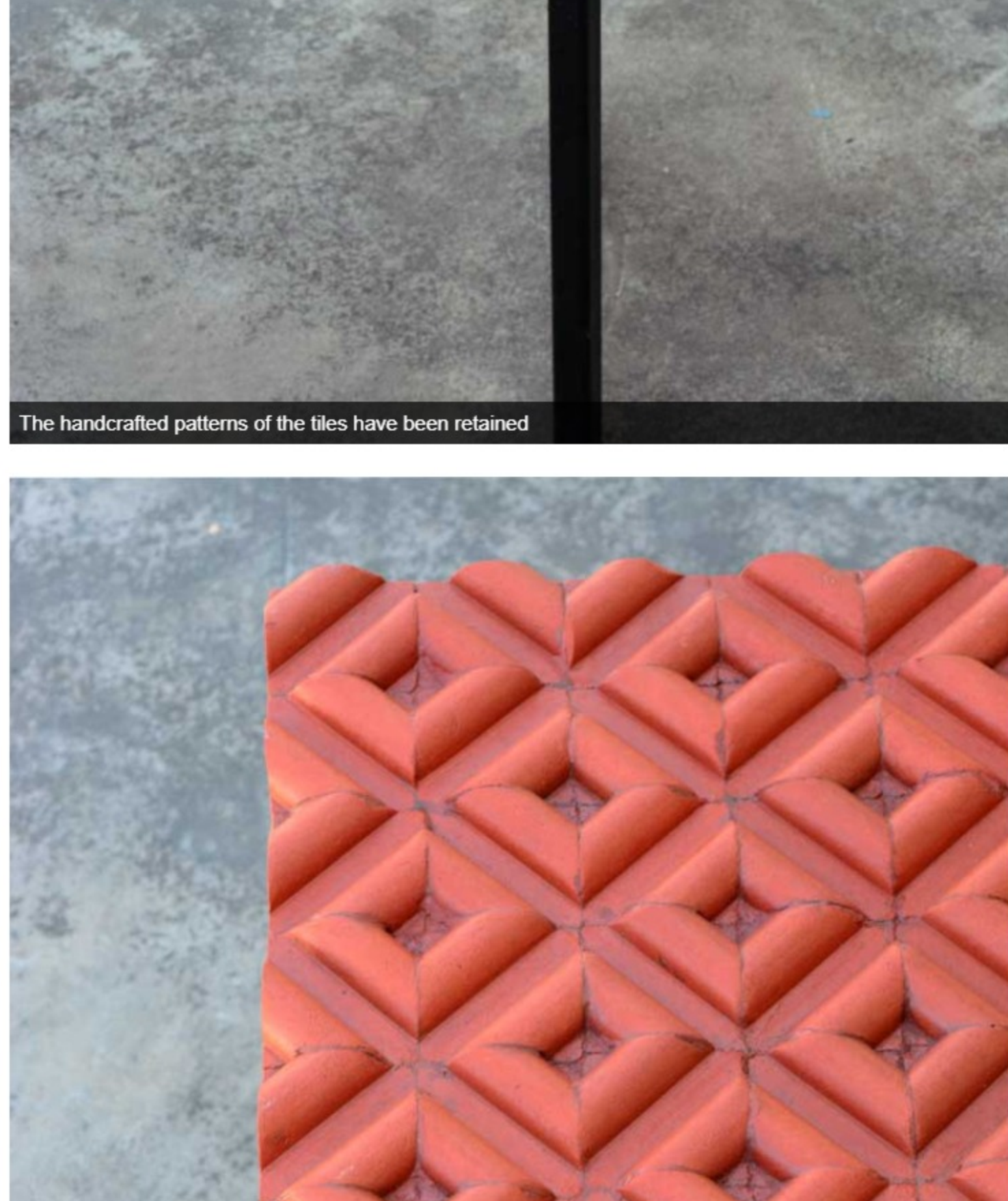

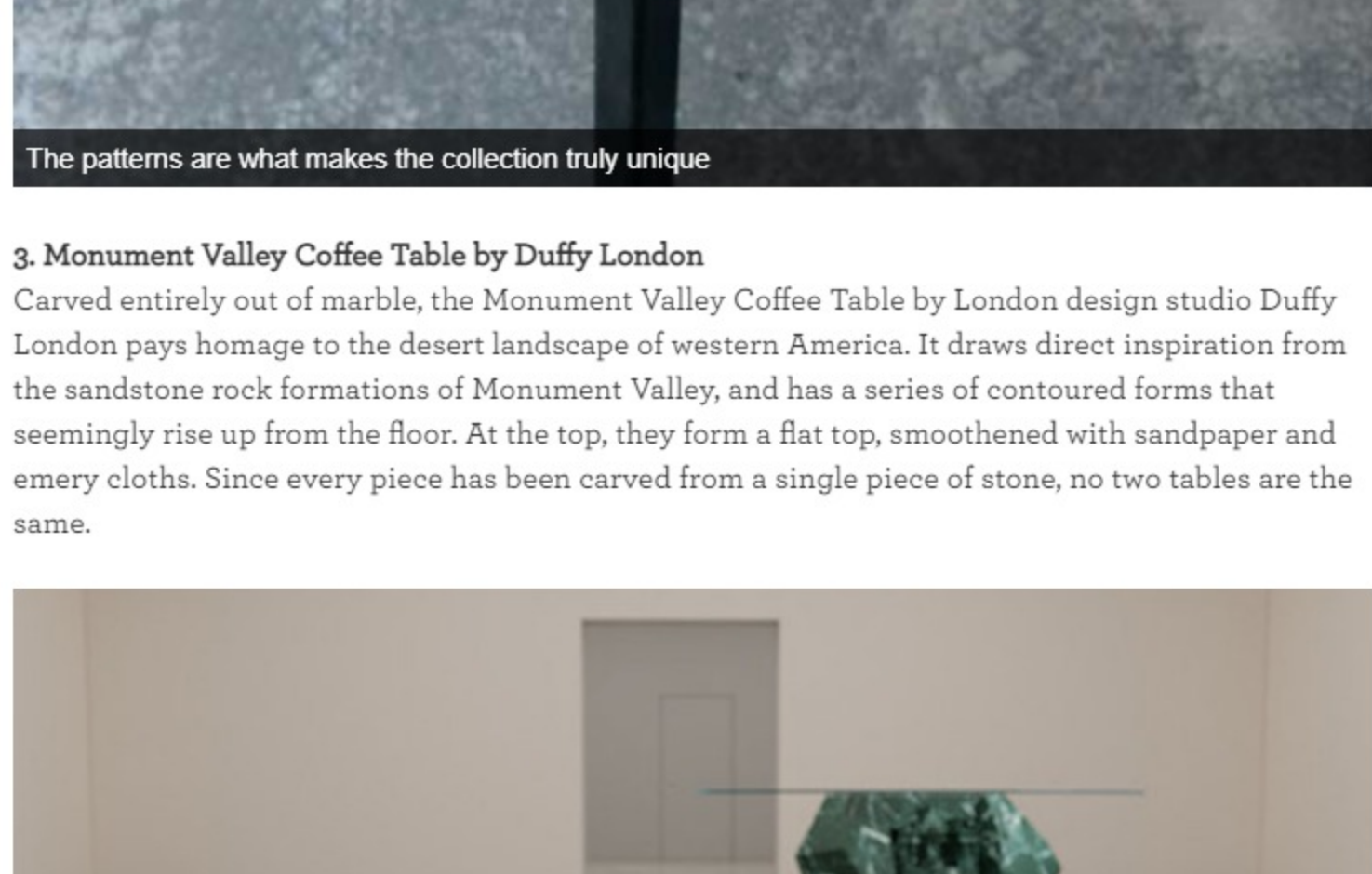

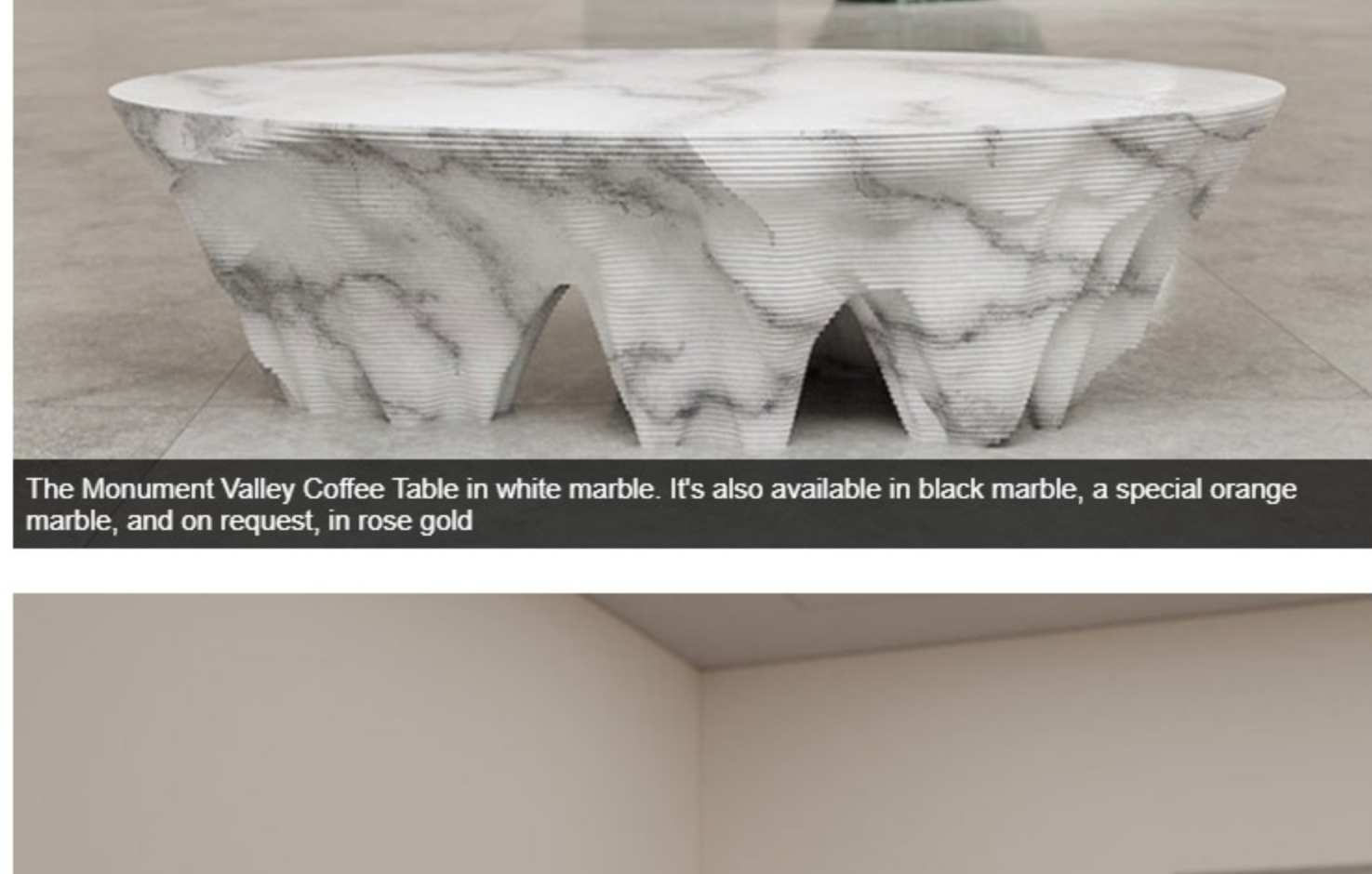

3. Monument Valley Coffee Table by Duffy London

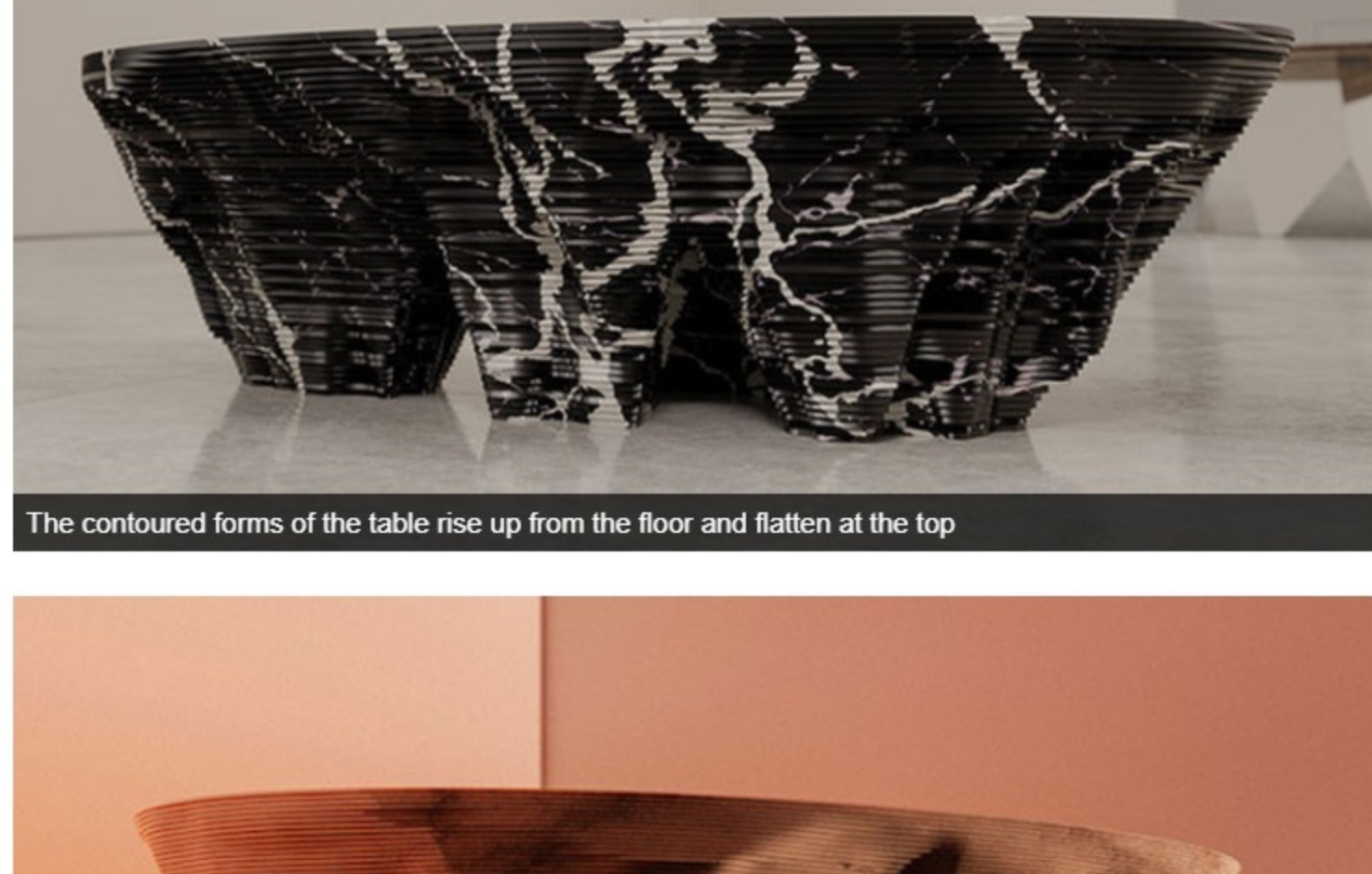
Carved entirely out of marble, the Monument Valley Coffee Table by London design studio Duffy London pays homage to the desert landscape of western America. It draws direct inspiration from the sandstone rock formations of Monument Valley, and has a series of contoured forms that seemingly rise up from the floor. At the top, they form a flat top, smoothed with sandpaper and emery cloths. Since every piece has been carved from a single piece of stone, no two tables are the same.
